Founder of World Toilet Organization, Mr. Sim is also an Ashoka Global Fellow and was named Time Magazine's 2008 "Hero of the Environment". He sits in the World Economic Forum's Global Agenda Councils (GAC) for Water Security and also the GAC for Social Entrepreneurship. Since its inception, WTO organized eight World Toilet Summits and two World Toilet Expo and Forum. Today, WTO is a growing network of 182 organizations in 54 countries.
